FROM WEST TO EAST: PERSPECTIVES ON THE PANDEMIC

Sunday, June 14, 2020 to Wednesday, July 29, 2020

From West to East: Perspectives on the Pandemic presents a unique overview of responses to the international coronavirus crisis of 2020. The exhibition hosts a selection of some of the strongest pieces of student work enrolled on the International Fine Art programme in Huanghuai University during China's national lockdown. Initially briefed to respond to the theme of 'Home' and the domestic interior at a time when 'isolation' and 'quarantine' become global buzz words; many of these works respond overtly to the uncertain political climate in which they were made.

The exhibition arises from a number of unprecedented teaching and learning challenges: for the lecturers quarantined in the UK, of coordinating teaching, tutoring and an online exhibition in another continent; for the students, of engaging with practical fine arts classes through the medium of online teaching. With the help of computer technology, apps, digital media publishing platforms, a team of translators and teaching assistants – a teaching term began unlike any other. The result is an intercultural dialogue between East and West in which the students imaginatively applied techniques of abstraction and fragmentation to their own choice of subjectmatter.

Many pieces of student work in this exhibition make the personal political in some way. In Shi Mengyuan's Constructed Still Life, a surgical face mask is deftly incorporated into an arrangement of everyday household objects such as stationary and kitchen articles. In other student work, the allusions to the coronavirus pandemic is yet more overt: Liu Yixian's painting Test portrays a plastic-suited medical professional taking temperatures at a drive-through test site. Wang Die's oil work, Kissing, presents two young lovers wearing surgical masks kissing through a glass partition; emphasising the feelings of separation and loss that the virus engendered across the world. Other timeless art historical motifs, such as the figure of a woman reading by a window featured in Wang Jing's


photographic joiner, Enjoy Life, assumes new meanings in the context of the coronavirus pandemic.

Inspired by themes such as windows in art, the figureless interior and the contemporary still life, as well as techniques derived from Michael Craig-Martin, Patrick Caulfield, David Hockney and Edward Hopper, the exhibition acts as a monument to a time which has arguably done more to define twenty-first century attitudes to the domestic interior than any other. As a whole, the exhibition asks how coronavirus has shifted our attitude to our own families, home and lives, but it also challenges the regionalism and subjectivity of the 'quarantine' experience, finding universal expression for a crisis that was experienced differently by every person, everywhere.


XU YUKE Still Life in the Kitchen, 2020




SHI MENGYUAN Kitchen Still Life from Above, 2020














